55 BC	Julius Caesar heads first Roman Invasion but later withdraws
44 BC	Julius Caesar is murdered in Rome
43 AD	Romans invade Britain and it becomes part of the Roman Empire
50 AD	London is founded
61 AD	Boudicca leads the Iceni in revolt against the Romans
70 AD	The Romans conquer Wales and the North
76 AD	The Emperor Hadrian is born
80 AD	The Colosseum of Rome is built
122-128 AD	Emperor Hadrian builds a wall on the Scottish border
140 AD	The Romans conquer Scotland
200 AD	Barbarians attack the Roman Empire
410 AD	Roman rule in Britain ends.

Boudica	Saxon queen who fought back against the Romans
Emperor Claudius	First Roman emperor to successfully invade Britain
Julius Caesar	Famous Roman leader who attempted to invade Britain.
Romulus and Remus	Mythical twin brothers and founders of Rome

Vocabulary	
<b>Amphitheatre</b>	Where the Romans would go to be entertained.
<b>Aqueduct</b>	A systems of pipes and channels used to bring water into the towns
<b>Barbarian</b>	A person who lived outside the Roman Empire, seen by Romans as violent and uncivilized.
<b>Celt</b>	People who lived in Europe, and in Britain, who fought the Romans.
<b>Emperor</b>	The leader of an empire. Similar to a king or queen.
<b>Invasion</b>	One country attacking another to take it over.
<b>Latin</b>	The language spoken and written by the Romans.
<b>Legion</b>	The main battle unit of the Roman army.
<b>Roman numerals</b>	the letters used by the ancient Romans to represent numbers, for example I, IV, VIII which represent 1, 4, 8.
<b>Senate</b>	The Roman government.
