


Year Reception Home Learning Grid – 6th July 2020 – Under the sea!

Maths	<p>Make some (up to 20) fish from different coloured paper and some blue paper for sea. If you have 4 fish in the sea and 3 more get in how many do you have altogether? !0 fish are happily swimming and 3 go home, how many are left swimming? Use your fish to practise adding and subtracting questions like these.</p>	<p>For a challenge with your adding and subtracting have a go at writing the number sentence to go with the questions: $4+3=$ $10-3=$ Can you write some number sentences for your grown up to have a go at?</p>	<p>Use your coloured fish to have a go at making a pattern</p>  <p>Can you use 4 colours? What other patterns can you make?</p> 	<p>Make your very own Under the sea scene! (this is just an example!)</p> 				
	<p>Build on your knowledge of halving from last time and have a go at this online lesson. https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/understanding-the-concept-of-half-479f36</p> <p>Then ask your grown up to make some other halving and doubling questions for you to try. I have 10 shells, I give half to the red fish and half to the blue fish. How many will they each get? I have 4 flags for my sandcastle and my friend has double the number I have. How many flags does my friend have? What's double 4?</p>	<p>Make some sea weed for your Under the sea scene. Make your seaweed different lengths and talk to your grown up about the length of the pieces. If you have a ruler or cubes at home you could try to measure the seaweed in cms or cubes.</p>	<p>Then talk to your grown up about the position of the different creatures and items. Try to use the words: behind, next to, under, between, in front, on The green fish is between the pink and yellow fish.</p>

What was your favourite part? Why? What characters were in the story? How did the characters feel? Curriculum/ Science	<p>Have a go at salt dough and make some star fish.</p>  <p>A starfish has 5 arms how many arms will 2 starfish have altogether? Can you practise counting the starfish arms in 5's? 5,10,15...</p>	<p>Watch this Cbeebies clip about an Under the sea song: https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/magic-door-under-the-sea</p> <p>Have a go and learn the moves to the Under the sea song and join in</p>	<p>Learn about sea creatures with this video: https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p011l4qy</p> <p>Find out 3 facts about sea creatures and make a poster to share your facts. What do they look like? What do they eat? Can you find an amazing fact about them?</p>	<p>Have a look around your home and find 2 things that you think will float and 2 things that you think will sink. Ask a grown up to help you test to see if you are right.</p>
	<p>Use paper plates to create different sea creatures!</p> 	<p>Imagine you have found a magic shell! You can have one wish. Draw a picture and write a sentence about what your one wish would be.</p>	<p>Try to do these things every day: Don't forget to read every day and update your Reading Diary. This could include reading the news, fiction, magazines, non-fiction.</p>
