Research famous mountain climbers and settings.</p>	<p>Write a persuasive holiday brochure for anyone wanting to visit the Alps for their holidays. Include sections about activities, foods, hotels and shopping etc.</p>	<p>Write a journey story about travelling in the mountains. Don't forget to include different obstacles along the way.</p>	<p>Write a poem about the Alps. Use figurative language e.g. similes, metaphors, personification, onomatopoeia and alliteration.</p>
